
BECOMING CATHOLIC

BULLYED ANTI-BULLYING PROGRAM - WEEK 3

Our school has adopted the BullyEd Anti-Bullying program which teachers will run in their classrooms for the next four weeks each Monday. We are taking a whole school approach in implementing this program so that the language and strategies used are familiar to all students and teachers. The program primarily operates from a preventative approach as well as utilising a restorative practice framework to build healthy relationships and school connectedness. The aim of the program is to reduce the tendency to be a bully as well as reducing the tendency to be bullied, by increasing all students' role as proactive bystanders. This is achieved by:

- 1. increasing knowledge and awareness of bullying
- 2. enhancing interpersonal skills and self-esteem of students to deal with bullying
- 3. developing strategies which empower students
- 4. mobilising students into more effective social networks
- 5. promoting resilience.

Modules 1 and 2: 'What Is Bullying?' and 'What Causes Bullying?'

In our modules this week, we are looking at what bullying is and what it isn't, identifying situations and appropriate examples. The tasks compare bullying to teasing or inappropriate behaviour and identifying the traits of each.

DRINK BOTTLES



Many students use reusable drink bottles which are much better for the planet, but health experts say there is a nasty surprise inside if we don't keep our cool keepers clean.

The Food Safety Information Council say water bottles should be cleaned daily, if not after every use.

As bacteria and fungi grow in bottles after touching mouths or being left in warm rooms for long periods, it is essential they are thoroughly washed.

It is important to let the residual water dry completely, as excess moisture acts as a breeding ground for nasties.

For those wanting a more complete clean, it is recommended leaving the different parts in hot water with two tablespoons of baking soda for 30 minutes, then rinsing thoroughly with clean water.

Children who are prepared to learn to read have less difficulty at school.

Show your child the right way to hold a book and that we turn pages from front to back. Help your child know that we read English from left to right, top to bottom. Track the print along the page as you read. Point out that the print is the words that tell the story, and the pictures show us what the places and characters look like. Point out punctuation. Explain that '?' means someone is asking a question, or '!' means someone is talking in a loud or excited voice.

WHAT TIME SHOULD I BE AT SCHOOL?

Our morning bell rings at **8:52am** (first bell)

We head to class at 8:55am (the second bell)

We advise that students are at school in time to find their friends and be ready for the school day when it commences. This helps reduce possible anxiety and ensures your child is set up for a positive start to their day.

EXPLAINING NON ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL
